



Information Sheet for Interested Students

What do I need to build?

Something related to video games. This could be something from an existing video game, like a character in pixel art form or a location from the game, or it can be a new original game inside Minecraft - similar to minigames like boat racing, parkour or Spleef.

Submissions will be shown to others, so your entry must be suitable for young people. Bad language, lots of violence, or rudeness are not. If you're unsure, check with an adult.

How do I submit it?

You must get a teacher, parent or guardian to submit what you have made. Their information sheet will include a link to the online submission form.

The submission should include **either**:

- a) **1-4 screenshots** of your build, taken without custom shaders or textures. **OR**
- b) A **world file** containing your build.

Plus some notes on what you have built or, if you built a game, how to play it. For information about how to export screenshots or world files, see the website below.

Who can participate?

Tasmanian students can participate either alone or in **groups of up to 5**.

You can get help from others, including adults, but what you submit should be your own idea and mostly your own work. We want to see what **you** can imagine and build.

When is it due?

Submissions close 11:59pm on **Friday 10th April 2026**.

What happens to my submission?

Judges will view and play all the submissions, selecting the best ones to be featured in an in-person showcase at the **Level Up Tasmania** gaming show event in Hobart on the **17th and 18th April 2026**. If you submitted screenshots, they may be posted on or around the booth. If you submitted a world file, it may be available to play at the event.

The top 3 stand-out entries (the ones which best represent the theme and make most creative use of Minecraft features) will be selected to each **win a \$100 gift card to Area 52** in Hobart, a pop culture shop with a wide selection of books, games, and merch.

All participants are invited to **visit the Level Up Tasmania event** and take photos with their entries or the judges to document their experience. **The event is free** for all.
